STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Fishing in Sullivan Brook, so-called in
the Town of Sullivan, Hancock County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Sullivan brook closed to fishing, established. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Sullivan brook, so-called, in the town of Sullivan, Hancock county.

Sect. 2. Penalties. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars, and costs, for each offence, and an additional penalty of one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of this act.

Sect. 3. Jurisdiction granted to trial justices, police and municipal courts. In all prosecutions arising under this act, trial justices, police, and municipal courts, within their respective jurisdiction, shall have original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme judicial court and the superior courts.
