STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating Fishing in Lovejoy Pond, in Albion, and
in its Tributaries and Outlet Stream.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Weight of catch. So much of the rules and regulations of the department of inland fisheries and game as limits the number of fish which may be taken in one day to ten fish in Lovejoy Pond, in the town of Albion, county of Kennebec, is hereby repealed, so that the number of fish which may be taken in said pond shall be regulated by the provisions of the general law.

Sect. 2. Open to ice fishing for pickerel only. Lovejoy pond is hereby opened to ice fishing for pickerel only.

Sect. 3. Tributaries and outlet stream closed. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch, kill, destroy, or have in possession at any time any kind of fish from any of the tributaries to said Lovejoy pond, or in the outlet stream of said pond (which outlet stream is commonly called Mill Stream) down to the fish screen on said stream.

Sect. 4. Penalty for violation. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
