## STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating Fishing in Lone Jack Pond, Little Lang Pond, and Parlin Stream.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Fishing in Lone Jack and Little Lang ponds, and in Parlin stream. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill, any kind of fish at any time, in Lone Jack pond and Little Lang pond, and in Parlin stream, which ponds and stream are situated in the county of Somerset, except it shall be lawful to fish in said ponds and stream in the ordinary way of casting with artificial flies or fly-fishing, so-called, during the open season provided by the general law; provided, it shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, kill or have in possession more than six fish in all in any one day in said waters.

Sect. 2. Penalty for violation. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
