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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

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AN ACT Relating to Blind Persons Entitled to Aid.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Persons entitled to aid. Section eleven of chapter one hundred fifty-eight of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out in the fourth line of said section the words "not exceeding" and inserting in place thereof the words 'not less than two hundred dollars nor more than,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 11. Persons entitled to aid. All persons over the age of twenty-one years, who are declared to be blind, in the manner hereinafter set forth, and who come within the provisions of the following sections shall, at the discretion of the governor and council, receive as a benefit not less than two hundred dollars nor more than three hundred dollars a year, for their exclusive benefit and support, payable at the close of each regular quarter, upon warrants drawn on the treasurer of state.'
