STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Facilitate the Passing of One Motor Vehicle by Another and to Lessen the Danger of Collisions

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. The driver of any motor vehicle when traveling upon a way outside of a business or residential district, unless it is a one way or a four lane road, shall not follow another motor vehicle within seventy-five feet, but this shall not be construed to prevent a motor vehicle overtaking and passing another, provided it pass at the first opportunity when nothing obstructs the view within a distance of three hundred feet and there is a clear space of at least seventy-five feet between the motor vehicle being passed and the motor vhicle next preceding.

Sect. 2. On three lane roads the distance between cars as provided in section I shall be not less than fifty feet.
