STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to State Pension Law

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 20 of chapter 158 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the word "more" in the sixth line thereof the words 'or has attained the age of sixty-five years and has been so employed with a good record for the term of twenty consecutive years,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 20. State employees to be pensioned after twenty-five years' consecutive service. 1919, c. 38, p 1. The superintendent and board of trustees of any state institution and the head of any state department may recommend the retirement from active service and the placing upon a pension roll, any employee who has been employed in any state institution or department of this state, with a good record for the term of twenty-five consecutive years, or more, or has attained the age of sixty-five years and has been so employed with a good record for the term of twenty consecutive years, and such employee, subject to the approval of the governor and council shall be so retired and pensioned.'

Sect. 2. Section 22 of said chapter 158 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words "clerks and other employees of" and inserting in place thereof the

words 'superintendents and other executives and officers, clerks and all other persons actually employed in or by,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 22. "Employee" defined. 1923, c. 199, p. 3. 1925, c. 118. The word employee shall be held to include superintendents and other executives and officers, clerks and all other persons actually employed in or by the several state departments and state institutions; also teachers in the state normal schools and the Madawaska training school, including such teachers as have retired since March first, nineteen hundred twenty.'
