AN ACT to Amend Fees of the Deputy Sheriffs Attending  
Court.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The following paragraph in Section 4, Chapter 126 of the Revised Statutes of 1930 reading as follows: "Every deputy sheriff and court messenger while in attendance upon the Supreme Judicial Court or Superior Court in their several counties shall receive for attendance and service five dollars a day; and the sheriff, at its opening, shall present to the court, a list of the officers attending, with the statement of the duties of each; and the court shall determine the number necessary, and disallow charges for others", is hereby amended by adding the following after the word "day": 'together with necessary incidental expenses, to be paid from the county treasury, the bills for which shall be audited as provided in section one of chapter one hundred forty-eight'; so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Every deputy sheriff and court messenger while in attendance upon the Supreme Judicial Court or Superior Court in their several counties shall receive for said attendance and service five dollars a day, together with necessary, incidental expenses, to be paid from the county treasury, the bills for which shall be audited as provided in section one of chapter

one hundred and forty-eight; and the sheriff, at its opening, shall present to the court, a list of the officers attending, with the statement of the duties of each; and the court shall determine the number necessary, and disallow charges for the others.'
