STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Trial Terms of Superior Courts in
Aroostook County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Trial terms in Aroostook county. Section twenty-one of chapter ninety-one of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the third paragraph of said section relating to Aroostook county, and substituting in place thereof the following paragraph:

'Aroostook: At Houlton on the first Tuesday of April and November and the third Tuesday of August for civil and criminal business, and at Caribou on the first Tuesday of February for civil business only. At every said August term the court, upon the completion of the business conveniently triable therein at said Houlton, shall adjourn to Caribou to there complete such civil business only pending in said court as ought to be and may be more conveniently there tried and heard; and the jurors in attendance at said August term at said Houlton, except grand jurors, may be required to attend such adjournment, or may be discharged, or new jurors summoned as the circumstances may require. This act to take effect on the first day of January, nineteen hundred thirty-two.'
