STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to State Geologist.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Compensation and expenses of state geologist. Section fifty-three of chapter forty-nine of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out said section and inserting in place thereof, the following section:

'Sec. 53. Compensation; expenses. The state geologist shall be paid ten dollars per day and expenses while actively engaged in the performance of his duties. He may employ assistants, purchase material and publish documents for which the state shall pay out of funds provided for the department.'
