STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Buoys and Beacons in Navigable Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 15 of Chapter 139 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the words "United States" in the second line thereof, the words 'or State of Maine' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sec. 15. Mooring vessels or rafts to buoys or beacons, and for destroying them; penalty. Whoever moors a vessel, boat, scow, or raft, to any buoy or beacon, placed by the United States or State of Maine in any of the navigable waters of the state, or in any manner makes the same fast thereto, forfeits fifty dollars; and whoever wilfully destroys any such buoy or beacon, shall forfeit one hundred dollars and be imprisoned for three months. Said forfeitures may be recovered by complaint or action of debt; half to the plaintiff or informer, and half to the county in which the trial is had.'
