STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Aid Persons who have Been in the Employ of
the State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Every person having been employed by the state for ten years and who has arrived at the age of seventy shall receive one half the amount he actually received per week, while in the employ of the state, so long as he or she lives.
