STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Elections in the City of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Secret ballot. The provisions of section fourteen of chapter eight of the revised statutes shall apply to all nominations for all offices at all elections, both primary and municipal, held in the city of Lewiston.

Sec. 2. Primary petitions. In order to have their names placed on the ballot for any primary election held in the city of Lewiston, the candidates for the following offices shall present to the city clerk by within two weeks of the date of the election a petition requesting their names to be so placed on the ballot:

For mayor, one hundred twenty-five names; for alderman, member of the school board, warden or clerk, twenty-five names.
