STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Townships of Township One, Range Nine, Township Two, Range Nine, Township Two, Range Ten, and Township Three, Range Ten, Piscataquis County.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of five thousand dollars for the fiscal year ending June thirty, nineteen hundred thirty-two, and five thousand dollars for the fiscal year ending June thirty, nineteen hundred thirty-three, to aid in the repair and maintenance of the Sourdnahunk road in and across said townships, all these townships in Piscataquis county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The whole distance along this road from Millinocket across Township Three, Range Ten, Piscataquis County, is approximately twenty-seven miles. There is a fairly good road the first eight miles from Millinocket to the Piscataquis County line, or where the road crosses from Township One, Range Eight, to Township One, Range Nine. From there on is where the proposed money shall be spent, on the road continuing across Township Two, Range Nine, Township Two, Range Ten, and Township Three, Range Ten, Piscataquis County. This road is by many miles the nearest way to approach Mount Katahdin. There is quite a heavy traffic from the Boy Scout Troops. Tourists from all over the country, fishermen, lumbermen, hunters, in fact by all and any parties who desire to get to the Mount Katahdin Reserve the shortest way.
