STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Granting Teacher's Pension to Cora B. Crabtree of Vinalhaven.

Resolved: That a pension of \$500 per year be, and hereby is, granted to Cora B. Crabtree of Vinalhaven, to be paid quarterly from the appropriation for teachers' pensions. Said pension shall begin July 1, 1931, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Miss Crabtree is a teacher with thirty-nine years of service to her credit. The law provides that twenty years of the service including the fifteen preceding retirement must be in Maine. Miss Crabtree's service in Maine is equivalent to approximately twenty-three years, making twenty-three of this in Maine and sixteen outside the state. However, the last twelve years only preceding retirement have been in Maine schools, up to June, 1909, for a period of fourteen and two-thirds years she had been teaching in Massachusetts. Legislative action is solicited to correct the technical objection in the statute.
