STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

RESOLVE, For State Pension in Favor of Rena Cooley of
Augusta.

Resolved: That a pension of three hundred dollars per year be, and hereby is, granted to Rena Cooley of Augusta for the benefit of herself and minor children, Violet and Evelyn, to begin July first, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, and to continue until otherwise ordered by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The husband of Rena Cooley was killed by a patient at the Augusta State Hospital on February 22, 1913, while an employee of that institution. Mrs. Cooley is unable to support herself and minor children by her own labor. She has received a pension from the State for a number of years; each Legislature having passed a new resolve since the original pension was granted.
