STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Carl Newton
of Lewiston.

Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Carl Newton, of Lewiston, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Carl Newton is the son of Charles L. Newton who served in Co. A, 12th Maine Infantry; Co. C, 13th Maine Infantry; and Co. K, 30th Maine Infantry, during the Civil War. His father died when he was a minor. He is in very bad physical condition and without means of support.
