STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Fishing in Howard Pond, in Hanover.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Establishing minimum length for trout and salmon. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch and kill, at any time, any trout less than eight inches in length or any salmon less than fourteen inches in length, in Howard Pond, in the town of Hanover, in the county of Oxford.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time any trout less than eight inches in length or any salmon less than fourteen inches in length taken in Howard Pond.

Sec. 2. Penalty for violation. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
