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## STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

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AN ACT Relating to Transportation of Paroled Prisoners.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Transportation of paroled prisoners. Section forty of chapter one hundred forty-seven of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the whole of said section and inserting in place thereof the following section:

'Sec. 40. State to furnish clothing and transportation to paroled prisoners. Whenever any prisoner is released upon parole he shall receive from the state, clothing not exceeding twenty dollars in cost, and transportation to the place where he was convicted, or to his home, if within the state; or if he has secured employment within the state, to that place. If he lived out of the state or if he has secured employment out of the state, he shall receive transportation to the state border, nearest his home, or nearest the place where he has secured employment.'
