## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Procuring Testimonials for the Purpose of Marking the Unmarked Graves of the Soldiers of the Revolutionary War.

Resolved: That the sum of eight hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the purpose of procuring testimonials to be used in marking the unmarked graves of the soldiers of the Revolutionary War.

Resolved further: That said sum be paid into the treasury of the Sons of the American Revolution, with which they are hereby authorized to procure and distribute such number of markers as may, from time to time, be required for the purposes herein specified.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

The Daughters of the American Revolution have been interested in locating the graves of Revolutionary soldiers buried in the State of Maine and when said graves are located they call upon the Sons of the American Revolution to furnish proper markers for the same. The fund for this purpose appropriated by the Legislature in 1927 is practically exhausted and if this work is to continue and the graves sought out and marked it becomes necessary that there should be an appropriation for the purchase of the markers.
