IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Penalizing the Use of Motor Vehicles in the
Commission of Crime.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Penalty for using motor vehicle in the commission of crime. The use of a motor vehicle to aid in the commission of any crime, or to escape from detection after the commission of any crime, shall be punished by a fine and/or imprisonment for the amount and term corresponding to the penalty fixed by law for the crime committed. This offense shall be considered as a separate crime from that originally committed, but may be alleged in the same warrant.
