IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relative to the Construction of Pole and Wire Lines
Upon and Along State and State Aid Highways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter sixty-eight of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting after section twenty-eight the following sections:

'Sec. 28A. The foregoing section shall not apply to state and state aid highways, but only to third class highways as defined in section five of chapter twenty-eight of the revised statutes.

Sec. 28B. No such company, person or association shall construct lines upon and along state and state aid highways without first obtaining a written permit signed by the state highway commission, specifying the kind of posts, where and how they shall be located and set, and the height of the wire above the ground. Any alteration in the location of said posts and wires as granted by the original permit, shall be approved by the state highway commission before becoming effective.'
