STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Reciprocity to Trucks Bringing Household Goods to Persons Dwelling in This State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty-one of chapter twenty-nine of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the word "exhibitions" in the third line of article first of said section, the following:

'Also any such vehicle bringing into the state as a load the household goods of any person who is dwelling in this state, or is about to dwell herein either permanently or for a period exceeding two months.' So that said article first of said section forty-one, as amended, shall read as follows:

'First. Any motor truck, tractor, or trailer brought into the state and used exclusively herein for display purposes in agricultural or industrial fairs, or in motor vehicle exhibitions; also any such vehicle bringing into the state as a load the household goods of any person who is dwelling in this state, or is about to dwell herein, either permanently or for a period exceeding two months. Provided, however, that the state or country under which said vehicle, or tractor, is registered grants like privileges to like vehicles, or tractors, registered in this state, and to operators thereof.
