STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Employment of Females.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Females to be employed only between 6:30 A. M. and 6 P. M. Chapter fifty-four of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after section twenty-one of said chapter a new section to be numbered twenty-one A and to read as follows:

'Sec. 21A. Females to be employed only between 6:30 A. M. and 6 P. M. No female shall be employed or permitted to work in any workshop, factory, manufactory or mechanical establishment, before the hour of six-thirty o'clock in the morning or after the hour of six o'clock in the evening.'
