IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Secondary Bells at Railroad Crossings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Secondary bells at crossings. Chapter sixty-three of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after section seventy-four of said chapter a new section to be numbered seventy-four A and to read as follows:

'Sec. 74A. Secondary bells at crossings. At all railroad crossings where lights or bells indicate the passing of a train, secondary bells shall be placed five hundred feet from each side of the track at the side of the highway to be operated and rung by connection with the aforesaid lights or bells.'
