STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Parking of Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Fifteen feet of passing space to be left on parking. Section seventy-five of chapter twenty-nine of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out in the seventh line of said section the word "ten" and substituting in place thereof the word 'fifteen,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sec. 75. No parking upon paved or improved portion of ways; exceptions. No person shall park or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, upon the paved or improved or main traveled portion of any way, outside of a business or residence district, when it is practicable to park or leave such vehicle standing off of the paved or improved or main traveled portion of such way; provided in no event shall any person park or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, upon any way unless a clear and unobstructed width of not less than fifteen feet upon the main traveled portion of said way opposite such standing vehicle shall be left for free passage of other vehicles thereon, nor unless a clear view of such vehicle may be obtained from a distance of three hundred feet in each direction upon such way.'
