# STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Create a Plumbing Rules and Regulations Council.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The Governor with the advice and consent of the Council, shall appoint a board to be known as the Maine State Plumbing Regulations Board, consisting of sixteen members, one from each county, all of whom must be practical plumbers or versed in the art of plumbing. The director of Sanitary Engineering of the State Department of Health shall be a member of said Board, and shall serve as chairman ex-officio.

The appointive members shall be appointed for a term of three years and they shall meet at the call of the chairman or at such times as they shall determine by their rules and regulations.

All appointed members shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for actual travelling expenses while in performance of their duties; said expenses to be paid from the appropriation of the State Department of Health.

All powers now vested in the State Department of Health for formulating and approving rules and regulations as well as approving or disapproving materials for all plumbing installed in the State of Maine are hereby transferred to said Plumbing Regulations Board, but this Board shall have no administrative powers.
