STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Appropriating Money to Build a Highway from Wilson's Mills in Lincoln Plantation, Oxford County, to Oquossoc, in Rangeley, Franklin County.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for the purpose of constructing a new state highway commencing at Wilson's Mills in the plantation of Lincoln in the county of Oxford, and state of Maine'; and thence running in a general easterly and southeasterly direction through Lincoln plantation and township four in Oxford county, and the town of Rangeley in Franklin county to Oquossoc, so-called, in said town of Rangeley, and that the same be expended under the direction of the state highway commission.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This road would connect two already improved roads and would give another direct route to central and northern Maine, from New Hampshire, Vermont, northern New York and states west. It would save about a hundred miles for tourists entering via Colebrook going to Franklin, Somerset and northern counties. The building of this road would open up a large territory for summer camp-owners now inaccessible. Four or five miles of proposed road is already passable for automobiles.
