STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Designate Certain Waters of the Kennebec River as Wyman Lake.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

From and after the date when this act takes effect, all the waters of the Kennebec river situated in the town of Moscow, Pleasant Ridge Plantation, Caratunk Plantation and Carrying Place, so-called, beginning at the Wyman Dam in the town of Moscow and extending northerly to a point on said Kennebec river opposite the village of Caratunk, said waters constituting the flowage from said Wyman Dam, shall be called and known by the name of Wyman Lake.
