STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Bertha M.
Spear of West Gardiner.

Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month be,
and hereby is, granted to Bertha M. Spear, of West Gardiner,
to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers
and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin
July first, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, and continue until
otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Bertha M. Spear is the daughter of John A. Spear, who served in Co. F, 14th Maine Infantry, and Co. A, 16th Maine Infantry, during the Civil War. She is 61 years of age, and in very bad physical condition and without means of support.
