STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Towns of Lincoln and Enfield.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Special provision for Lincoln under three town act. For the purpose of completing a continuous highway from the village of Lincoln to the village of Enfield in the county of Penobscot, said town of Enfield is authorized to unite with the towns of Lincoln, Lee and Winn under the provisions of sections twenty-six to thirty-four, inclusive, of chapter twenty-eight of the revised statutes;—to raise and appropriate money and shall be entitled to receive from the state the apportionment as provided in said chapter and be subject to all the provision thereof.

Said highway, locally known as the "Cold Stream Pond" road in the towns of Lincoln and Enfield to be designated as a spur to three town act road from Lincoln to Burlington, and any funds that have been expended by the town of Lincoln on the so-called Burlington road in anticipation of future state aid funds shall be included with the funds expended on the "Cold Stream Pond" road project to be reimbursed from the Lincoln state aid joint fund for the construction of the "Cold Stream Pond" road.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The "Cold Stream Pond" road from Lincoln to Enfield is one of the most important roads in that vicinity, connecting two important villages, serves a large summer colony in addition to local residents, and is traversed by an R. F. D. Route.
