STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Authorize the Construction of a Weir in the Tidewaters of Chandler Bay in the Town of Jonesport.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Edward B. Sawyer and John V. Sawyer authorized to maintain fish weir in Chandler Bay. Edward B. Sawyer and John V. Sawyer of Jonesport, in the County of Washington, and assigns, are hereby authorized to build and maintain a weir for fishing purposes in the tidewaters of Chandler Bay, in said Jonesport, provided said weir does not interfere with navigation or with the rights of others.

Sec. 2. Location and specifications. The above mentioned weir shall be located as follows: The pound to be located southwesterly and about one hundred yards from the Moose ledge located off Popplestone Beach on the eight feet spot as indicated on United States Coast and Geodetic Survey chart No. 304 of waters from Cross to Nash Islands, and at Popplestone Beach. Said pound to have a swing of twenty fathoms with two wings or leaders therefrom, one extending in a general northerly direction to the shore of Popplestone Beach, and the other extending in a westerly direction to the shore of said beach.
