STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the construction of a road in the City of
Augusta.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

For the purpose of completing a continuous highway between the city of Augusta and the village of Oakland through the towns of Augusta, Sidney and Oakland, over the so-called Pond Road in the town of Sidney, said city of Augusta is authorized to raise and appropriate money under Sections 25 to 32, inclusive, of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930, and shall be entitled to receive from the State apportionment as provided under said chapter and be subject to all the provisions thereof.

The increased bonus under the three town act, over that available under the five times act, amounting to \$7590.00, shall, on agreement between the State Highway Commission and the municipal officers of Augusta, be expended on the so-called Pond Road in Sidney in connection with a portion of the State aid funds available to the town of Sidney, beginning at the north end of the improved section in the town of Sidney, about two miles from the Augusta line, and extending in a northerly direction.
