STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the construction of a road in the Town of
Oakland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

For the purpose of completing a continuous highway from the village of Oakland through the towns of Oakland, Sidney and Augusta, over the so-called Pond Road in the town of Sidney, said town of Oakland is authorized to raise and appropriate money under Sections 25 to 32, inclusive, of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930, and shall be entitled to receive from the State the apportionment as provided under said chapter and shall be subject to all the provisions thereof. In order to be able to complete that part of the road within the town limits of Oakland this act will permit the State Highway Commission to expend the third class highway money with the State aid money on this location.
