AN ACT Relative to Temporary Number Plates on Motor  
Vehicles.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Temporary number plates. Chapter twenty-nine of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after section sixty, three new sections, to be numbered sixty A, sixty B, and sixty C, as follows:

'Sec. 60A. Purchaser of motor vehicle to have temporary number plates. A manufacturer or dealer may upon the sale or exchange of a motor vehicle, attach to such motor vehicle a set of temporary number plates, and the purchaser of such motor vehicle may operate the same for a period not to exceed seven consecutive days thereafter without payment of a registration fee.

Sec. 60B. Secretary of state to be notified. A manufacturer or dealer shall, upon attaching a set of temporary number plates to a motor vehicle sold or exchanged by him, mark thereon the date when said license expires and immediately notify the secretary of state of said sale or exchange, giving the name and address of the purchaser, the number on the temporary plate, and such further information as the secretary of state may require.

Sec. 60C. Issuance of plates. The secretary of state shall issue special temporary plates to all dealers that request them, and shall receive for them fifty cents per pair.'
