### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of William H. Soucia.

Resolved: That the Forest Commissioner be, and hereby is authorized and empowered to convey the interest of the State of Maine in and to the following described parcel of land situated in Township No. 14, Range 6, W. E. L. S., Aroostook County, and being a part of the public lot in said Township, to wit: All that portion of the public lot in said town which is cultivated and is part of the so-called Soucia farm, reserving the gravel pit thereon, the location and size to be determined by the Forest Commissioner.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

The Grandfather of William H. Soucia settled on Winchel Hill over seventy years ago and for many years the place has been called Soucia Hill. This farm and the farm next south of it known as the Henry Soucia farm, has been occupied by various owners since the building of the so-called Aroostook Road, from Ashland to Fort Kent in 1839, and the part of the farm included in the public lot as above described, has been cleared for many years; and the buildings which go with the farm are on the State's land.
