STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relative to Bounty on Bobcat, Loupcervier, and Canadian Lynx.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seventy-seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes is hereby amended by prefixing to said section the words 'during the period commencing August first, nineteen hundred thirty-one and ending July thirty-first, nineteen hundred thirty-three'; and by striking out in the first line thereof the word "ten" and inserting in lieu thereof the word 'twenty,' so that the first paragraph of said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 77. Bounty on bobcat, loupcervier, and Canadian lynx. During the period commencing August first, nineteen hundred thirty-one and ending July thirty-first, nineteen hundred thirty-three, a bounty of twenty dollars for every bobcat, loupcervier or Canada lynx killed in any town shall be paid by the treasurer of state to the person killing it upon compliance with the following conditions:'
