IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of New Sharon.

Resolved: That there be appropriated the sum of twelve hundred seventy-five dollars and no cents to reimburse the town of New Sharon for the maintenance and repairs of the New Sharon bridge; said funds to come from highway maintenance funds.

STATEMENTS OF FACTS

The bridge was built for the benefit of the through traffic from Augusta to Rangeley Lakes. Repairs on the bridge, because of new construction of state highway, have been unusually large. The new construction has caused the necessity of re-planking the bridge last fall. This resolve is to reimburse the town for the planking last fall only. It is a hardship and unreasonable burden for the town to stand this expense. The planks and stringers cost \$809.00 and the labor costs \$466.00.

This is a state-wide proposition and an obligation that the state, instead of the town, should assume.
