STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relative to the Construction of Pole and Wire Lines Upon and Along State and State Aid Highways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter sixty-eight of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after section twenty-eight the following section:

'Sec. 28A. In all cases in which a permit or the alteration of a permit is sought under section twenty-eight with reference to post or wire lines upon and along state and state-aid highways, the municipal officers in the case of cities and towns, and the county commissioners in case of plantations and unorganized townships, shall before granting such permit, or alteration of permit, give to the state highway commission written notice of at least fourteen days in the case of the original grant of a permit and at least seven days in the case of an alteration of a permit in order that said commission may have full opportunity to appear and show cause, if any they have, why such permit should not be granted or altered; or if granted or altered, to suggest such restrictions and conditions as seem to be necessary for the public safety.

Provided however that said state highway commission may in their discretion waive such notice in any particular case.'
