IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relative to the Minimum Age for Fishing Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Minimum age for fishing licenses. Section nineteen of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the whole of the first paragraph thereof, and by inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sec. 19. Fishing licenses for residents and non-residents; fees therefor; revocation thereof. No resident of the state over sixteen years of age and no non-resident over the age of ten years shall fish in any inland waters of the state except in accordance with the following provisions:'

Sec. 2. Junior non-resident fishing license. Sub-section (3) of said section nineteen of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out, in the first line thereof, the word "two", and by inserting in lieu thereof the word 'three'; and by inserting after the word "license" in the fifth line thereof the following: 'also a junior non-resident license, which shall be a season license covering all non-residents between the ages of ten and fourteen years, inclusive, to cost one dollar and fifteen cents' so that said sub-section (3), as amended, shall read as follows:

'(3) Non-resident licenses shall be of three classes, a month license to cost three dollars and fifteen cents, effective for thirty

days from the date thereof, and a season license, effective for the entire season, to cost five dollars and fifteen cents, but the amount paid for a month license shall be credited on the purchase of a year license; also a junior non-resident license, which shall be a season license covering all non-residents between the ages of ten and fourteen years, inclusive, to cost one dollar and fifteen cents. Fifteen cents shall be retained by the agent.'
