STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Subordinate Officers of the Senate.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Section thirty-seven of chapter two of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by adding to the end thereof the following, 'after the election of the President, the Senate shall proceed to elect by ballot a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Sergeant at Arms, an Assistant Sergeant at Arms, a Postmaster, a Doorkeeper, and two Pages.'

Sec. 2. Section eleven of chapter one hundred twenty-five of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out all of said section and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sec. 11. The subordinate officers and employees of the senate. The secretary of the senate shall perform the usual duties of the office during the session of the legislature, file and index all papers, which have been subject to adverse legislative action, index and supervise the publication of the senate journal, and in addition thereto devote the month of December of the year following the legislative session to the work of making preparation for the incoming legislature. He shall also perform the duties required of him by sections thirty-seven and forty of chapter two. He shall also deliver

to the librarian of the Maine State library all papers on file in the office of the secretary of the senate which were considered by a session of the legislature held more than ten years previously and the state librarian shall inspect said papers and preserve all those having any historical or permanent value. He shall receive a salary of two thousand dollars in full for all official services by him performed during the regular session of the Legislature.

The assistant secretary of the senate shall receive a salary of twelve hundred dollars; his work shall be performed under the direction of the secretary.

The official reporter of the senate shall receive a salary of seventeen hundred fifty dollars.

The sergeant at arms shall receive a salary of six hundred dollars.

The assistant sergeant at arms shall receive a salary of four hundred fifty dollars.

The postmaster shall receive a salary of five hundred dollars.

The doorkeeper shall receive a salary of three hundred dollars.

The pages shall each receive a salary of three hundred dollars.

The postmaster, doorkeeper and pages shall perform their duties under the direction of the sergeant at arms.

The above salaries shall be in full for all official services performed during the regular session of the legislature, and no other compensation shall be allowed them, except in case of an adjourned or special session of the legislature.
