STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Creating a Recess Committee to Study the Needs and Requirements of Aviation and Its Development.

Resolved: Section I. That a recess committee consisting of two members on the part of the senate to be appointed by the president of the senate and three members on the part of the house to be appointed by the speaker of the house is hereby created to make a comprehensive study of the needs and requirements of the state of Maine, its municipalities and other sub-divisions of government with respect to aviation and its development, and shall recommend to the legislature such measures as it may find desirable and expedient in relation Said committee shall choose from its members a chairman and a vice-chairman and may employ such assistants and fix their compensation within the amount appropriated for this resolve as it may deem necessary to aid this work. The members of said committee shall receive no compensation for their services but shall be allowed their necessary traveling and hotel expenses. Said committee is hereby authorized to sit and hold hearings both within and without the state, within the United States, and may take testimony subpoena witnesses and require the production of books, records and papers, and otherwise have all the powers of a legislative committee under the legislative law.

- Sec. 2. The committee shall make a report to the legislature on or before January fifteen, nineteen hundred thirty-three, and shall include in such report such proposed laws and amendments to existing laws as it may deem necessary to carry its recommendations into effect and also a statement of its acts and proceedings.
- Sec. 3. The governor and council are hereby authorized to pay out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated all such expense as may be incurred by said committee in the fulfillment of the provisions of this resolve, but not to exceed one thousand five hundred dollars.
