New Draft of House Order.

STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Creating on Old Age Pension Recess Committee.

Resolved: That the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council, shall appoint a committee of not more than five members which shall be known as the "Committee on Old Age Pensions." The committee shall meet as soon as convenient after appointment and organize by choosing a chairman and secretary.

Such committee shall consider the necessity and feasibility of such legislation for this state; consult the pension laws of other states, and determine, so far as possible, the success other states are experiencing with similar laws.

Finding such legislation necessary and practical, they shall draft an Act covering the matter and present the same to the eighty-sixth Legislature.

Members of said committee shall receive their actual expenses and such per diem compensation as may be approved by the Governor and Council.
