STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT to Prevent the Maintaining of a Black List in Industry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Maintaining a black list in industry prevented. Section 27 of chapter 138 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding in the 4th line of said section, after the word "corporation", the following words: 'and any employer, agent of an employer, or other person, who, alone or in combination with others, attempts to prevent a wage earner in any industry from obtaining employment at his trade, by maintaining, or being a party to the maintaining of, a black list,'; so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 27. Preventing by threats, any person from entering or leaving employment; maintaining of black list; penalty. Any employer, employee, or other person, who by threats of injury, intimidation or force, alone or in combination with others, prevents any person from entering into, continuing in, or leaving the employment of any person, firm, or corporation, and any employer, agent of an employer, or other person, who, alone or in combination with others, attempts to prevent a wage earner in any industry from obtaining employment at his trade, by maintaining, or being a party to the maintaining of, a black list, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500, or by imprisonment for not more than 2 years.'
