IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Non-resident Fishing Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Sub-section 3 of § 19 of c. 38 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows :

Four classes non-resident licenses; ten day non-resident licenses. '(3) Non-resident licenses shall be of **four classes, a ten day license to cost one dollar and fifteen cents, effective for ten days from the date thereof,** a month license to cost three dollars and fifteen cents, effective for thirty days from the date thereof, and a season license, effective for the entire season, to cost five dollars and fifteen cents, but the amount paid **for a ten day license or** for a month license shall be credited on the purchase of a year license; also a junior non-resident license, which shall be a season license covering all non-residents between the ages of ten and fourteen years, inclusive, to cost one dollar and fifteen cents. Fifteen cents shall be retained by the agent.'
