## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Hunting in Washington and Hancock Counties.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Trapping in Washington and Hancock counties regulated. The 1st paragraph of § 72 of c. 38 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Trapping season regulated. Whoever hunts or traps any fur-bearing animal except wild hares and rabbits (which are protected under the provisions of § 39), bob cats, loupcervier, Canada lynx, or muskrat, within the following enumerated closed seasons; or whoever has in possession at any time any fur-bearing animal or part thereof taken in closed season, shall be subject to the penalty provided in this chapter;—(1) For the counties of Androscoggin, Cumberland, York, Sagadahoc, Kennebec, Lincoln, Waldo and Knox, from February I to November 15, both days inclusive. (2) For the counties of Aroostook, Penobscot, Piscataquis, Franklin, Somerset and Oxford, from February I to October 15, both days inclusive. (3) For the counties of Washington and Hancock, from February 15 to October 31, both days inclusive.'

Note. This act merely changes the seasons for Washington and Hancock counties, although the wording of the old paragraph has been changed to simplify the wording.
