IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED
AND THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Pedestrians on State Highways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Pedestrians to walk on left hand side of state highways; penalty. All pedestrians walking in or on a first-class state highway outside of built-up sections shall walk on their left hand side thereof so that they will be facing on-coming auto-motive traffic, excepting when they are crossing such highways or of necessity therein. The provisions of this act shall not be construed to excuse drivers of motor vehicles from using due care under the circumstances. Whoever violates the provisions of this act shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$5 for the first offence and not more than \$10 for succeeding offences.
