AN ACT Appointing a Commission on Medical Education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Sec. 1. Appointment of commission on medical education. The governor, with the advice and consent of the council, shall appoint five citizens from the state, two of whom shall be from the members of the 86th legislature, to be known as a commission on medical education. Such commission shall serve without pay, but shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses incurred while engaged in the duties of such commission. They shall meet as soon as convenient after their appointment, at such place as they shall select, and shall choose one of their members to be chairman and they may employ a competent clerk. Such commission shall study and consider the question of medical education and the advisability of the establishment of a medical college in the state.

Sec. 2. Report. Such commission shall, on or before Jan. 1, 1935, make a written report to the governor and council, which report shall be transmitted to the clerk of the house of representatives on the organization of the 87th legislature and shall include such recommendations for legislation as the commission may adopt with the draft of such legislation as may be suggested.

Sec. 3. Appropriation. The sum of \$500 is hereby appropriated for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act.
