IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Relating to Ice Fishing in Eagle, Square and St. Froid Lakes.

Emergency Preamble. Whereas, the inhabitants of the territory surrounding Eagle, Square and St. Froid Lakes are in destitute circumstances, and the burden thereby imposed on the surrounding towns is more than they can bear, and

Whereas, if the inhabitants of the aforesaid territory could fish in Eagle, Square, and St. Froid Lakes, they could obtain food and thus relieve the danger of starvation, and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section sixteen of article thirty-one of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, now, therefore, be it

Eagle, Square and St. Froid Lakes opened to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation opening to ice fishing, Eagle Lake, Square Lake, and St. Froid Lake, all in Aroostook county, under the general law, for 1933, and if in his opinion the present emergency exists at that time to open the said lakes to ice fishing in 1934 under the general law.

Emergency Clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
