## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Regulating Trapping of Wild Animals within the Counties of Waldo and Knox.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Trapping of wild animals in Waldo and Knox counties, regulated.** Section 72 of c. 38 of the revised statutes is hereby amended so that the 1st paragraph of said section shall read as follows:

Trapping season regulated with reference to counties. Who-'Sec. 72. ever from the 1st day of February to the 15th day of November, both days inclusive, hunts or traps any fur-bearing animal except wild hares and rabbits (which are protected under the provisions of section 39 of this chapter), bob-cats, loupcervier, Canada lynx, or muskrat, within the counties of Androscoggin, Cumberland, York, Sagadahoc, Kennebec, Lincoln, Waldo, and Knox and within Knox and Waldo counties from the 1st day of February to the 1st day of November, inclusive, except foxes; and foxes from the 15th day of February to the 1st day of November; or whoever from the 1st day of February to the 15th day of October, both days inclusive, hunts or traps any fur-bearing animal except wild hares and rabbits (which are protected as aforesaid), bob-cats, loupcervier, Canada lynx, or muskrat, within the counties of Washington, Hancock, Aroostook, Penobscot, Piscataquis, Franklin, Somerset, and Oxford; or whoever has in possession at any time any fur-bearing animal or part or parts thereof taken in closed season, shall be subject to the penalties of this chapter.'
