Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, sec. 21; ice fishing in China Lake and Mud Pond. Section 21 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes is hereby amended so that the portion of the 19th paragraph of section 21 relating to China Lake and Mud Pond, in lines twenty-seven to thirty-two, shall read as follows:

'China Lake (1921, c. 198) and any of that portion of said lake, known as Mud Pond, which lake and pond are situated in the town of China and in the town of Vassalboro in Kennebec County, except that fishing is lawful in said China Lake and Mud Pond in accordance with the general law relating to ice fishing on ~~Thursday, Friday and Saturday~~ **Saturday and Sunday** of each week during February and March.'
